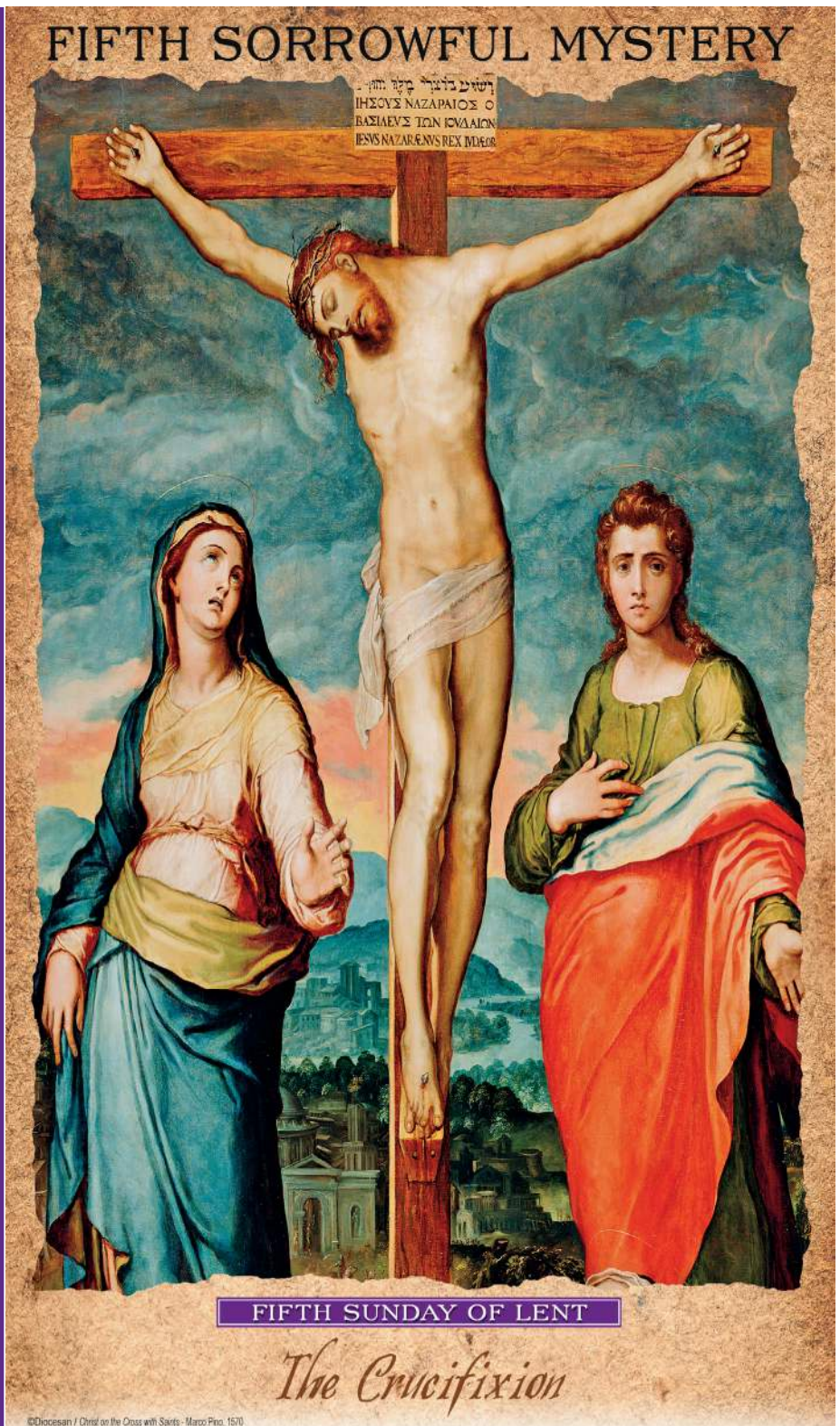

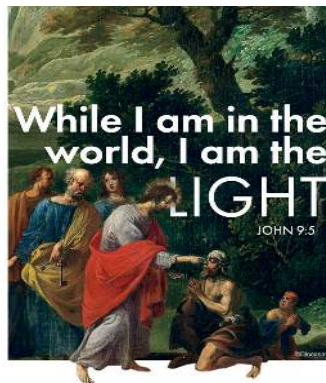

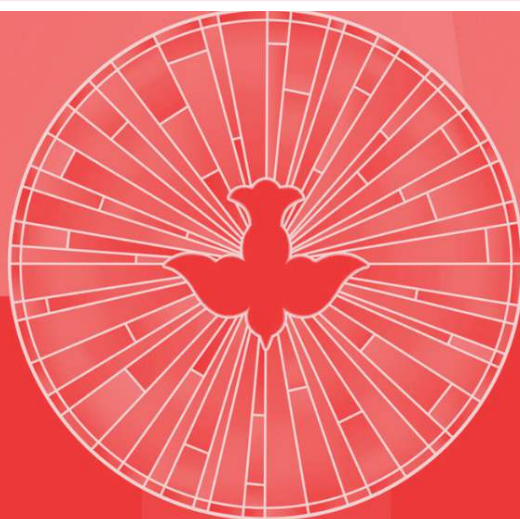

The Annunciation of the Lord

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord recalls the historical event of the angel Gabriel appearing to the Virgin Mary. It celebrates the Church's faith in the underlying reality that took place at that moment in time--the Incarnation.

In modern times, this feast day has taken on special meaning in Respect Life ministry. Scientific advances have allowed us to confirm that life begins at conception. This solemnity helps us to recognize the gift of new life from its very beginning. It calls us to reflect on how we are to care for, protect, and welcome new life, as the Blessed Mother did for the Christ child.

Mary, as the first disciple, models for us the need to listen to and do God's will. Prayer and action go hand in hand. Living with an open heart to God's will looks different for each person, but Mary's example and intercession encourage us to also open our hearts to say 'yes' to God.

The angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary.

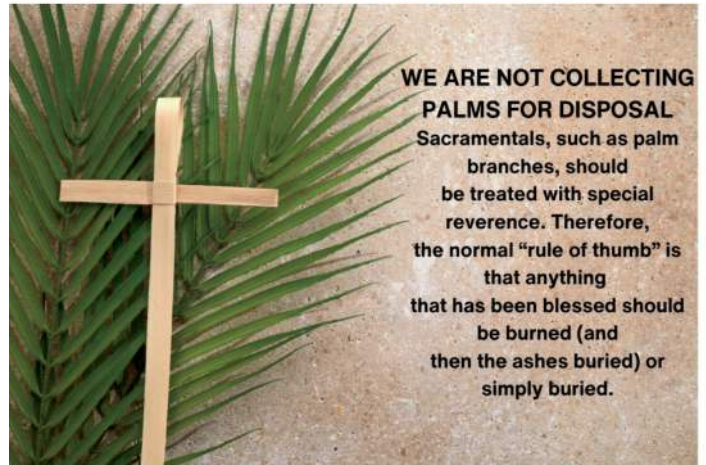
The 2026 Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal has begun!

Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

ABOUT OUR FAITH DIVINE MERCY MESSAGE AND DEVOTION

To receive any Plenary Indulgence, the faithful must receive sacramental confession, receive Eucharistic Communion, and pray for the intentions of the Pope (usually an Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be) in addition to the spiritual work for the indulgence. A Plenary Indulgence can be offered for oneself or for the souls in Purgatory.

Divine Mercy Sunday Plenary Indulgence

According to the decree of Indulgences attached to devotions in honor of Divine Mercy, the following conditions (specific works) must be met on Divine Mercy Sunday to receive this Plenary Indulgence:

- Be in a state of grace
- Be detached from every affection for sin, including venial sin
- Take part in prayers and devotions in honor of Divine Mercy in the presence of the Eucharist exposed or in the Tabernacle (i.e. some sort of Divine Mercy service).
- Recite the Our Father and the Creed
- Add a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (i.e. Recite the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, Venerate the Divine Mercy Image, or any Divine Mercy prayer from the heart, etc.)

Of course, to ensure that one is in a state of grace to fulfill the Indulgence of Divine Mercy Sunday, it is appropriate to go to Confession "about 20 days" before or after Divine Mercy Sunday. The Sacrament of Reconciliation during the Lenten season suffices.

Dear Parishioners,

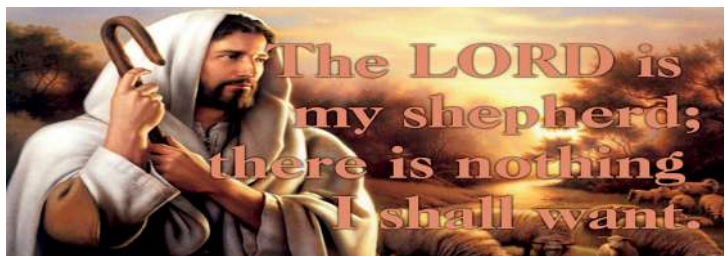

HOLY WEEK AND THE PASCHAL TRIDUUM

Sunday, March 28 - Sunday, April 4, 2010

"The days of Jesus' life-giving death and glorious resurrection are approaching, the hour he triumphed over Satan's pride, the time we celebrate the great event of our redemption" (Preface of the Lord's Passion II, Sacramentary). Thus the Church begins the one week of the year that we formally designate as "Holy." Simple rituals can link the domestic church to parish church and Church universal. Enthroned Sunday's palms where you pray, behind the family crucifix, even as part of front door decorations: "Christ reigns here," they proclaim; "all are welcome!" During the first three days of Holy Week, ready Easter clothes, prepare festival foods, clean the house, and beautify the yard. Late Holy Thursday afternoon, share Lent's final meal before the Lord's Supper Mass. Pitcher, bowl, and towel make a fitting centerpiece; perhaps conclude the meal by washing each other's feet. On Good Friday, observe the paschal fast from food—from TV and computer, too! Then come to Holy Saturday's Vigil with mind clear, stomach empty, and heart full of "holy anticipation" that bursts into living flame when the new fire is kindled.
