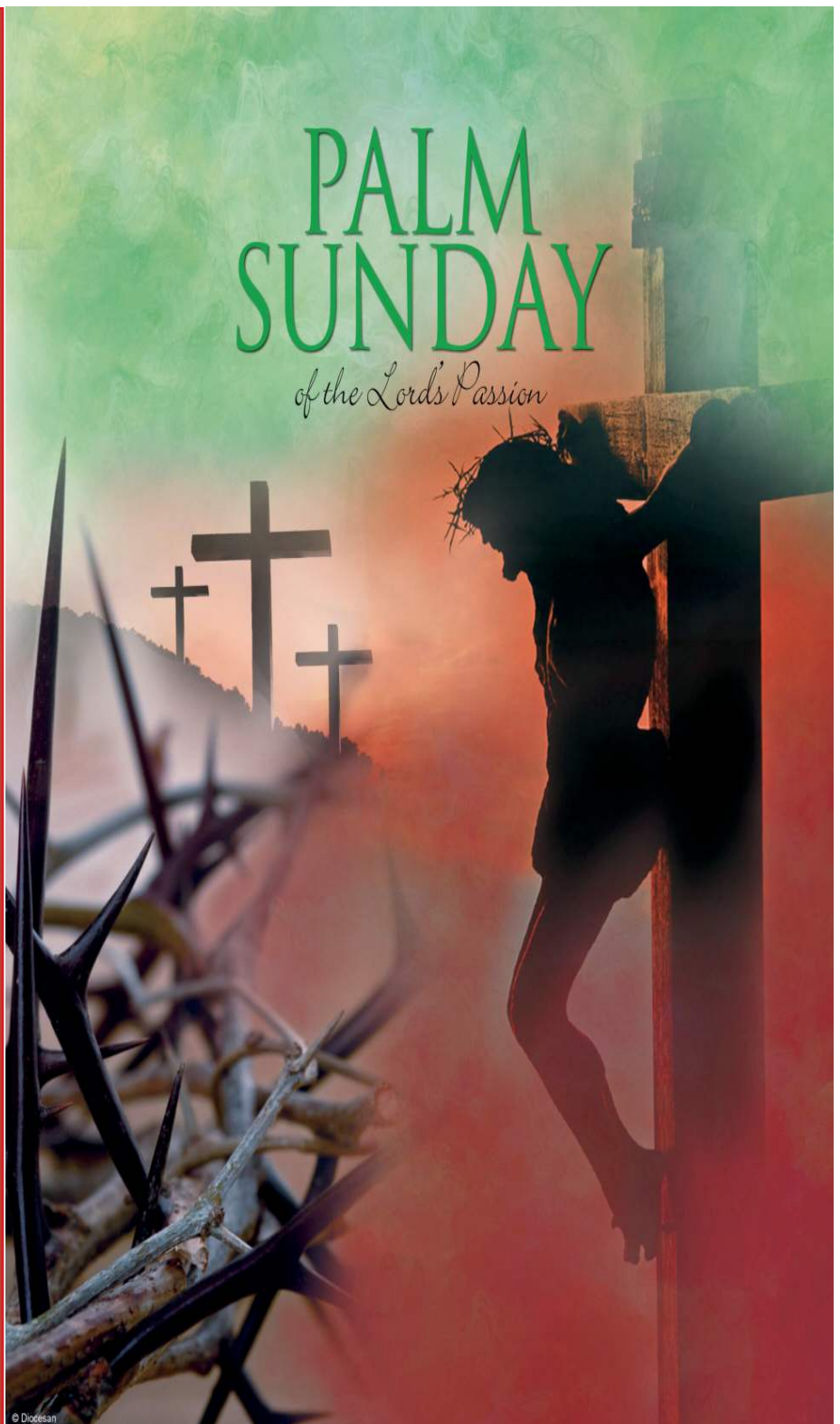

Adult Faith Formation

Entering Into Holy Week

Holy Week is the holiest week of the year. But why do we call the entire week “holy”? Does anything important happen on the days between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday? As we continue our Lenten journey, the liturgical significance of this momentous time of year helps us to ponder more deeply the mystery of God and draw us into His infinite love.

Palm Sunday

We begin the spiritual pilgrimage of Holy Week holding blessed palm branches and recounting Jesus’ triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The Gospel reading then includes the Passion narrative, which invites us to further reflect on God’s great love, and the sacrifice He was willing to endure because of that love for us. As you think about Jesus’ triumphant entry or his great sacrifice, what are ways in which you give all glory, laud, and honor to God? It is with the celebration of Jesus’ entry on Palm Sunday that the Church’s liturgy solemnly opens Holy Week.

Monday of Holy Week

According to tradition and Scripture, Holy Monday is the day on which Jesus cleansed the temple. While often used as an illustration of ‘righteous anger’, it is also a prophetic demonstration: “what sign do you show us for doing these things?” clearing the way for the right worship of the Lord God. What, in these final days of Lent, do you need to ‘cleanse’ to prepare your heart for right worship of God?

Tuesday of Holy Week

Tuesday of Holy Week is also known as “Fig Tuesday”, and we remember the time Jesus cursed a fig tree (Matthew 21:12-22). How about you, are you being “fruitful”? Do your good works reveal a life of prayer and nearness to Jesus? Remember to have faith in the love and mercy of God.

Wednesday of Holy Week

Wednesday is sometimes called “Spy Wednesday” as it recalls the day that Judas sought the means to betray Jesus for 30 pieces of silver (Matthew 26:14-16). This betrayal recalls the Old Testament story of Joseph sold by his brothers to a traveling band of Ishmaelites bound for Egypt. (Genesis 37-50). Let us remember today the deep wound in Christ’s loving Heart at the betrayal of Judas—and perhaps look into our own hearts, too, to see when we might have preferred the things of this world to the superabundant love of Christ.

Sacred Paschal Triduum

The Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday—is the summit of the Liturgical Year. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ’s Paschal Mystery. The Sacred Triduum is the climax to Lent because it is the heart of God’s saving acts made present to us today in the liturgy. Participation in the unique and beautiful liturgies of this Holy Week help you enter into a more joyous Easter season.

Reconciliation

Receiving God’s Mercy

Lent is an ideal time to celebrate the reconciling love and the healing graces our Lord offers us. Reconciliation is what God does. Receiving it is what we do. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a beautiful way to celebrate His forgiveness and love. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an opportunity to grow closer to God.

Not Sure How To Go To Confession? If it’s been a week or a decade, the merciful heart of Christ burns with love for you, and He wants us to experience His immense and unfathomable mercy by confessing our sins and receiving His forgiveness. Our parish website has several helpful resources to aid you in returning to this Sacrament, including videos and a handy ‘examination of conscience’ guide.

“Confession is an act of honesty and courage – an act of entrusting ourselves, beyond sin, to the mercy of a loving God.” Saint Pope John Paul II

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, by the grace of the Holy Spirit, we seek forgiveness and repentance, let go of patterns of sin, grow in the life of virtue, and witness to a joyful conversion. We are set free!

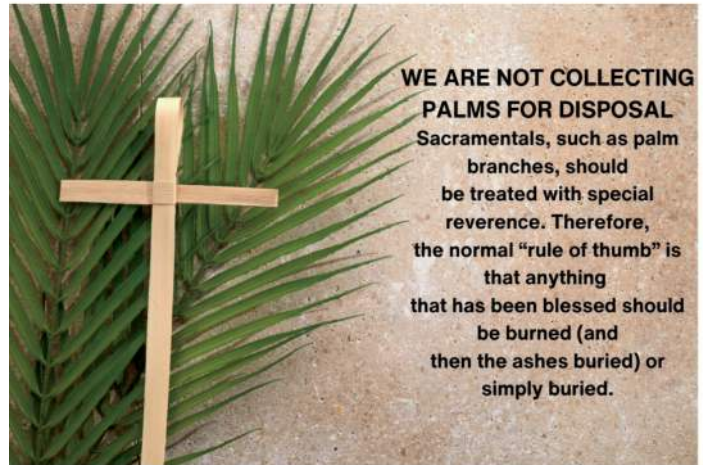
The 2026 Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal has begun!

Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

We have been informed by the diocese through our Catholic Mutual Insurance policy, that the individual Easter Vigil candles present a substantial risk for potential injury. Therefore, parishioners are prohibited from using candles throughout the church.

The Vigil Mass will remain very prayerful and spiritually uplifting. We will continue the rich tradition of beginning the Liturgy outside at the fire, while processing with the Paschal Candle through the dark Church, symbolizing our Risen Lord. Thank you for your understanding and assistance in keeping everyone safe.

ABOUT OUR FAITH DIVINE MERCY MESSAGE AND DEVOTION

Divine Mercy Sunday Special Graces by Jesus through Saint Faustina

In her Diary, Saint Faustina records a special promise given to her by Jesus. The conditions emphasize the importance of Reconciliation and Holy Communion as miracles of mercy:

- Take advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (usually about 20 days before or after the Feast Day, so during the Lenten season suffices)
- Remain in a state of grace
- Receive Holy Communion on Divine Mercy Sunday (or the Vigil Celebration)
- Simply trust in the mercy of God

The special graces promised by our Lord through Saint Faustina in this private revelation can only be received for oneself. The special grace is equivalent of a complete renewal of baptismal grace in the soul (i.e. complete forgiveness (remission) of sins and temporal punishment). Such a measure of grace can only be received otherwise through baptism itself or through making a sacramental confession as an act of perfect contrition for sin, out of pure love for God.

SAINT FRANCIS OF PAOLA (1416-1507)

April 2

A witness to miracles from a young age, Francis of Paola later went on to perform many himself. His parents struggled with infertility, so turned to the intercession of St. Francis of Assisi. Their devout prayers bore them a son, whom they named Francis out of gratitude. As an infant, Francis suffered from swollen eyes and was again healed by his namesake. His parents promised him a friary education, where young Francis voluntarily abstained from meat, practiced solitude, and prayed fervently. After a year, he went on a pilgrimage with his parents to Assisi which deepened his devotion. Upon their return, Francis committed to the life of a hermit, first on family property before moving to a remote cave near the sea. A couple others were inspired by his journey and joined him, forming a small hermitage with a chapel. Over several decades, they expanded to a larger church and monastery as more followers joined. They became known as the Minims Friars, minim meaning least to convey their humility. They valued poverty, chastity, obedience, and later added veganism to their vows. Francis is said to have performed many miracles: prophetic speaking, food appearing from nothing, casting out demons, and raising the dead. Despite a life of solitude, he was sought out by many, popes and kings even calling on him for counsel. In his old age, Francis returned to complete solitude for three months, before passing on Good Friday—fitting for a life of perpetual Lent. Francis embodied love for God through radical vocation, giving his all in everything he did. While we may not be as radical in our own lives, the same call of love is extended to us today. —Meghan McDonagh
